Highlights of the fiscal year ending June 30, 2007

- Total private support received by the Institute and its associated foundations totaled \$119.4 million, up 24% from FY2005-06 (as reported to the Council for Aid to Education), representing the second most productive fundraising year in the history of the Institute.
- New gifts and commitments recorded in the third year of the quiet phase of Campaign Georgia Tech exceeded \$173 million, representing a 32% increase from FY2005-06 and bringing the Campaign total to more than \$430 million against an initial goal of one billion dollars by December 2010.
- Forty-two principal gifts and commitments of one million dollars or more led the increase in giving. Of this number, two-thirds were first time donors to the Institute at the principal gift level.
- Qualifying gifts and commitments of more than \$10 million were committed in support of the newly-announced Georgia Tech Promise initiative, designed to fill the gap in the financial aid protocol, picking up where Georgia's HOPE Scholarship and other financial aid vehicles leave off. The program is intended to assist Georgia students whose families have an annual income of less than \$30,000.
- The dedication of the Klaus Advanced Computing Building and the Molecular Science and Engineering Building provided recognition for donors whose gifts in excess of \$25 million made each building a reality.
